## Communication Between Home and School Procedure

### 1. Objective

A parent and community guide for seeking information and expressing concerns. To provide a guide for parents/carers who wish to seek information and/or express concerns about school related matters whilst on school grounds. Our school understands that from time to time, parents/carers or other members of the school community may need to approach the school in order to:

- discuss the progress or welfare of their own child;
- express concern about actions of other students;
- enquire about school procedure or practice;
- express concern about actions of staff; and/or
- express concern about the actions of a parent/community member.

It is therefore necessary to have procedures that will help solve problems as soon as possible, so that a safe and harmonious school environment is maintained. The best results usually flow from working together.

### 2. Guidelines

These guidelines aim to:

- provide a guide so that concerns are dealt with in a transparent and fair manner;
- ensure that the rights of students, teaching staff and parents are respected and upheld;
- support sensitivity and confidentiality, and
- help reach an outcome which is acceptable to all persons involved.

Our school understands that concerns may cause frustration. However, it is important to organise a time to talk with school staff in an unhurried, calm and confidential atmosphere.

### 3. Enactment of 'Inclosed Lands Protection Act 1901

Principals (or an authorised representative of the principal) has the legal authority to deal with people who enter onto, or remain on school property, and behave in a way which would be considered offensive or threatening in the mind of any person(s) who are present on school grounds at the time. In this instance, the principal (or an authorised representative of the principal) may:

- direct the person to immediately leave the grounds;
- call the police to remove the person should he/she refuse;
- issue a warning or withdraw future permission (by letter) for the person to enter the grounds without permission of the principal, and/or
- seek further legal avenues.


### 4. Other Guidelines

- Parents must direct all school-related matters to the school office, relevant class teacher or principal, and under no circumstances are they to approach a child or contact other parents directly about such issues. It is the school's responsibility to investigate and address student welfare issues following Departmental guidelines.
- Meetings should be requested via the school office. To support the immediacy of responding to a parent concern, the school will acknowledge the receipt of the request and provide meeting options/preferences for the parent, taking into account the timetabled teaching day constraints for staff members and time needed to investigate parent/student concerns. All efforts will be made to schedule a productive meeting (or follow up phone call) within 48 hours.

### 5. Quick Tips (Reference Table)

Consider the following table as a reference guide when dealing with common school related concerns.

Concern	Who to Contact
Student welfare, school procedures, academic, curriculum, excursion, health care or financial queries (Note: these must relate to your own child only)	Class teacher or executive staff member, via the school office
Feedback on the school's strategic directions, organisational budget, implementation of Departmental procedures and annual school assessment processes	Principal, via the school office
P&C fundraiser projects or business items	Principal (via the school office) or P&C President
Counsellor assistance or additional learning support queries (i.e. E/ALD, support learning assistance)	School office – who will arrange for the appropriate staff member to speak with you, or contact you at the next available opportunity
Specific school procedures or practices	Principal, via the school office
Actions of a parent/community member	Principal, via the school office
Actions of other students	Class teacher or executive staff member, via the school office



## **Amazing Learning in 1-3A**



1-3A has had a wonderful term full of fun, engaging in various activities expanding on their gross motor and fine motor skills.

**GYMNASTICS PROGRAM**

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

In Semester 2, we will be running the very successful gymnastics and Dance program run by qualified instructors from Fit Futures and Dance2BFit. Over the past five years our students have really enjoyed these lessons and are looking forward to participating again this year.

The Gymnastics lessons will run for 30- 40 minutes each week over ten weeks, commencing in Term 3 on Friday, 16 July and will conclude on Friday, 17 September. In Term 4, 5 October DanceToBFit will comment and conclude Friday 10 December. The lessons will introduce and develop proficiency in a number of gymnastic skills, such as flexibility, strength, spatial awareness and balance.

Commencing Friday, 16 July 2021 every Friday for 9 weeks and also in Term 4, 5 October 2021 we are running Footsteps dance program. Footsteps Dance is an energetic, innovative and fun way to get fit and funky with the latest dance styles to the hottest music tracks. This is a great program to improve the fitness levels of students while having a great time.

The total cost for both programs is \$90.00. The school understands the financial pressures such a large cost can put on families, therefore, are willing to cover a large percentage of the cost with the support of the Sports in Schools grant and the remainder funded by Lansvale East Public School. This results in the cost of both sporting programs being reduced to a subsidised rate of \$40.00.

These lessons are part of the Physical Education, Health and Personal Development syllabus and all children are expected to participate.

The \$40.00 per student can be paid in full, by 2 x \$20.00 instalments or by weekly instalments of \$5.00 each. The first instalment is due by July, 2021 and the final payment by the October 2021.
