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Healthy Harold 2022

Thursday, 27 October 2022

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

This term we will be enhancing our Personal Development and Health (PDHPE) program with a school visit from Life Education (Healthy Harold). The programs address many of the components and objectives within the NSW PDHPE curriculum. Programs are selected based on age and run for 60 minutes for K-2 classes and 90 minutes for 3-6 classes.

Harold's Friend Ship - Kindergarten – Year 1 - Explores how to build friendships and care for others, feelings and emotions, safe and unsafe situations and early warning signs, safe places and people to turn to for help.

Safety Rules - Years 1-2 - Problem solving, personal safety, seeking help, how to care for others and behaviours that maintain friendships

bCyberwise - Years 3-4 – Explores cyber safety through animation, vox pops of children, relevant scenarios, discussion & problem solving. Including investigating how to recognise, react and report unwanted contact.

Relate, Respect and Connect - Years 5-6 – Teaches the knowledge, skills and attitudes that children need to develop and maintain safe and respectful relationships both on and offline. Including investigating consent and how to recognise, react and report unwanted contact and predatory behaviour.

The school visit will commence on Thursday 10 November to 15 November. The cost will be \$5.00 per student for the life education session. POP payments are also available online.

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Field of Mars Excursion

Thursday, 10 November 2022

Dear Parent/Caregiver,

In Term 4, students in Early Stage 1, Stage 1 and Stage 2 have been learning the Geography Unit, *Features of Places*. To support students' understanding of this unit, an excursion to the Field of Mars Environmental Education Centre has been organised. Students will participate in a bush walk through mangrove and eucalypt forests along the Buffalo Creek Reserve.

During the excursion, students will use a variety of hands-on fieldwork tools to participate in sensory and immersive experiences such as invertebrate hunts, exploring the mangrove forest, creating banksia creatures, crab hunting (tide permitting) and creating a memory map of their day's journey using natural materials.

What to wear:	Full school sports uniform and closed toe, comfortable walking shoes.
What to bring:	Small backpack with hat, sunscreen, water bottle, lunch and recess. Please ensure your child's name is on his/her bag. (<mark>Students DO NOT need any spending money</mark>).





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
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FUN FACT-
