
From the Principal's Desk

This Term K-3A and 5-Z have been exploring various sight words. We have explored the use of words such as of, as, the. We have also began exploring our weekly sounds using Soundwaves through hands on learning activities by exploring the classroom for objects that start with the sound of the week.

In Mathematics we have explored concepts such as half past and quarter past through using manipulatives. We have also been exploring various 2D shapes through drawings and finding items in the room that are a circle, square, rectangle or triangle.


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LEPS Sports News

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Walking to school safely

Never too old to be safe

Pedestrians and drivers have a shared responsibility on and near roads and need to look after each other.

Staying safe while out walking:

- plan your walking routes
- avoid busy roads, if possible
- choose the safest place to cross
- walk the extra distance to use a pedestrian crossing, traffic island, pedestrian lights or overhead bridge, if available
- walk on the far right hand side of the road facing oncoming traffic, when there is no footpath.

Before you cross the road:

unplug your earphones and put away your phone

avoid crossing between parked cars or at the front or back of buses and large vehicles

vehicles before you leave the kerb

look out before you step out.

Using pedestrian crossings

- stop at the kerb until cars have completely stopped, as drivers don't always see you
- try and make eye contact with the driver before you cross, so you know they have seen you
- wait for the walk signal
- don't enter the road if the red 'Don't walk' signal shows
- when safe, promptly walk across the road, continually scanning and listening for oncoming traffic.

- acting safely on and near roads.

Using Westpac QuickWeb

Dear Parents,

Online payments are accessed through the home page of the school's website:

www.lansvalee-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au

The school website will have an option on the menu bar "Make a Payment".

When you click on this you will be taken straight to the Westpac QuickWeb page.

Payers will complete the necessary details, some of which are mandatory before confirming the payment details and completing the payment. A receipt can be printed from the payment page.

The payment screens are:

- Entering payment details
- Entering credit card details
- · Confirmation of payment details and
- Online payment receipt

Payments can be made by Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card only. The school does not see any details of your card.

Please ensure you enter the child's correct name, class and details of what you are paying for. These details are necessary so that the payment is credited to the correct child.

All payments made before 6.00pm each day will be received at the school the next day. Payment after 6.00pm will not be received by the school for two days.
