






### What is a PLaSP?

A PLaSP is a Personalised Learning and Support Plan. It is a working document designed by teachers in collaboration with all stakeholders that informs ongoing planning, delivery and evaluation of a student's educational program.

#### The PLaSP:

- Identifies students individual needs and priorities for learning
- Outlines short and long term educational goals for a student and the actions, strategies and adjustments that will be used
- Is a flexible living document that is reviewed and modified over time
- Share information
- Review progress
- Review existing PLaSP
- Identify interventions, strategies and resources
- Discuss new information
- Discuss plans and future goals
- Establish short and/or long term priorities, learning goals and outcomes.

#### WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

The interventions, strategies and supports outlined in the PLaSP are put into place.

Progress towards identified goals is monitored and reviewed regularly. It is recommended that this occurs at least once a term. A specified review period can be as short as two weeks or as long as one year depending on the needs of the student. Following the initial meeting a PLaSP will be written, will all participants signing and receiving a hard copy. You may request a review by contacting your classroom teacher.

Your child will be required to:
